Major Government funding and commitment to PE and School Sport was announced on 8th March 2023. This aims to help to boost equal opportunities in PE and School Sport both inside and outside the classroom.

There are five key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

1. Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
2. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
3. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

This document displays the actions we are doing as a school to ensure the indicators set by the Department for Education are met at Norbreck Primary Academy.

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently, and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	75.8%	Our National Curriculum Swimming Lessons are delivered by the Fylde Coast's Largest Independent Swim School - Big Fish Little Fish Swim School. They are the only STA Swim Star Accredited Swim School on the Fylde Coast and the only swim school on the Fylde coast to have its own STA Aquatic Teacher Tutor & Assessor. We have confidence in the high standard of teaching and the rigorous assessment before children are awarded their school swimming award.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [e.g., front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	75.8%	Correct technique to promote water safety and personal survival is the absolute priority for the swimming school.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	75.8%	Our swimming lesson provider will always ensure any learner who takes part in our lessons leaves safe, confident & happy in water.
